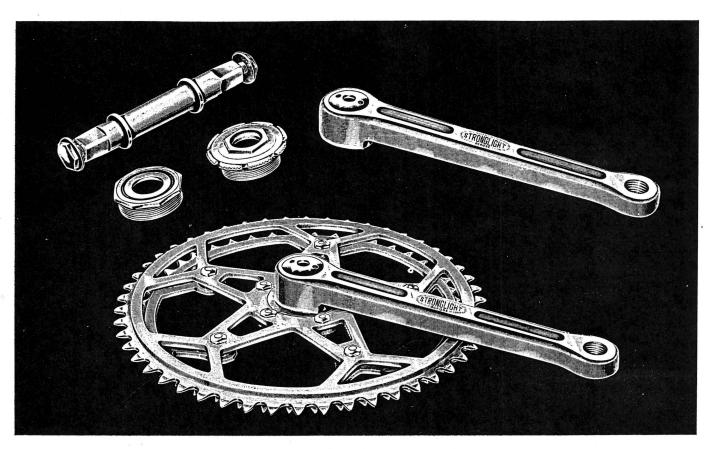

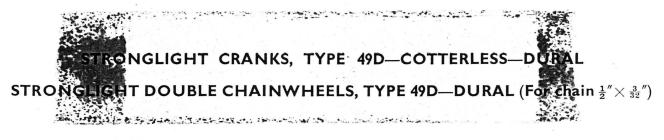

The cranks and the rings are made from forged and hardened high resistance light alloy.

The cranks are made to fit a Stronglight Cotterless Bottom Bracket Axle. This axle is made from high quality steel.

CRANKS: Pedal thread to take British Dimension pedal. Cranks are available in lengths of $6\frac{1}{2}^{"}$, $6\frac{2}{3}^{"}$ and 7 inch.

CHAINRINGS : Outer Rings Ref. 12 available 49, 50, 51, 52 teeth, delivered with all screws.

Inner Rings Ref. No. 12BIS is available 44, 45, 46, 47, 48 teeth, dolivered without any screws.

Screws and Nuts :

Ref. No. 10—Set of one screw and bush (Ring No. 12 to crank). Ref. No. 12 Ter.—Set of one screw, washer and bush (ring to ring).

Assembling and Dismantling :

A special tool is provided—See Page No. 3.

NOTE : Type 49 D cranks may be used for track or road racing with a single ring type 32 or type 49D outer (Ref. No. 12). In this case cotterless axle type 32C should be used.

Type 49D cranks are delivered per one pair boxed (one right hand without screws, one left hand). Necessary screws are delivered with outer Ring, Ref. No. 12.

With this set we deliver our Axle, Ref. No. 32R.

Cotterless Axle ref. 32R is delivered with double chainwheel sets type 49 and type 57.

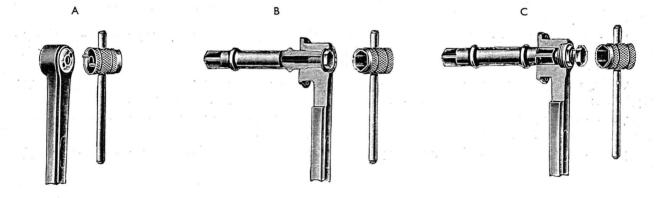
If a shorter axle is required, suitable for double chainwheel, fit Axle Ref. No. 97.

If shorter axle is required for use with set type 49 fitted with single ring, (track or road), fit axle ref. 32C.

If these sets are fitted with triple rings, fit axle ref. 97/TR1.

Fitting of cotterless cranks to Axle

- (1) Unscrew dust cap from crank using tool as shown on Illustration A.
- (2) Lubricate with light vaseline inside of crank, inside and outside of axle. This is to minimise friction as the Axle is drawn into the crank.

Fit crank to Axle and push gently by hand.

DO NOT HAMMER OR USE TOOLS OTHER THAN THOSE WE PROVIDE.

Lubricate axle screw with vaseline, and screw it into the axle, making sure that the threads are not crossed and that no forcing is necessary.

Use tool as shown in illustration B, and screw-in axle screw as far as it goes without excessive forcing.

(3) Screw-in dust cap to crank as shown in illustration A. NOTE : Most important.

After a few hours cycling, tighten axle screw again.

From time to time and **before every race**, check and tighten axle screw. This precaution is necessary to avoid damaging the cranks.

(4) To withdraw cranks, unscrew dust cap as in Para. 1 above. Insert withdrawing tool as shown in illustration C. Before inserting this tool, lubricate all threaded parts with vaseline and lubricate also the threaded part inside the Head of the crank. Take the greatest precautions when

vaseline and lubricate also the threaded part inside the Head of the crank. Take the greatest precautions when using the withdrawing tool and do not force otherwise you may strip the withdrawal threads in the head of the crank.

If the crank is jammed, tap gently to loosen using a wood or plastic instrument.

(5) To insert pedal, lubricate with vaseline both the pedal axle threads and the threads on the crank. Pedals are threaded right hand and left hand. Make sure the correct pedal is screwed into the correct side crank. Screw in gently and make sure you are not crossing the threads. Then screw in pedal axle fully.



"SUPER-COMPETITION"

TYPE 57

This is undoubtedly the most advanced design in Racing Chainwheel Sets made to-day in any Country.

Most racing men know that in any of the standard sets, to withdraw the rings for altering teeth sizes or for replacing, it is necessary to withdraw the pedal and in many cases to withdraw the crank from the Bottom Bracket Axle. Nuts and Bolts are usually damaged in the process since in all such sets the traction effort is applied on these Nuts and Bolts and they must perforce be tightened to maximum. In most racing sets there are 10 complete sets of Nuts and Bolts subjected to this traction effort, and all of these have to be withdrawn when a ring has to be changed.

In modern racing, changing rings to get desired gearing is effected regularly and in sets other than the **STRONGLIGHT** "Super Competition", it is a lengthy job. With the new STRONGLIGHT "Super Competition" Type 57 this problem hardly exists.

Five sets of Nuts and Bolts only are used and these assemble the two independent rings to the specially designed Type 57 Crank.

Crank and Rings concentricity, which is an absolute necessity in racing sets, is achieved with the greatest possible precision in the Type 57 Set, not only through careful manufacture but primarily as a result of the revolutionary design of the new crank.

"Type 57" Cranks are machined to precision limits and so are "Type 57" Rings. This is necessary since the rings must fit precisely on the shaped shoulders on the arms of the crank. These shoulders bear the full traction effort and the screws are used mainly for securing the rings to the crank.

This design ensures also absolute ring rigidity and the very minimum ring deformation under pedalling. The gap between the two rings is designed to take a $\frac{3}{32}$ chain and this gap will remain constant.

This set as all STRONGLIGHT products, is made of the very best materials. It is specially designed for the discriminating rider for whom only the best is good enough.

Riders who have already got STRONGLIGHT Type 49 Cotterless Set, may convert their set to the Type 57 by purchasing One Right Hand Crank Type 57 together with two rings in the teeth combinations required.

RINGS "TYPE 57 "

Made of high quality dural, these rings are machined to precision limits. The inner and outer rings are interchangeable and are available for chain $\frac{1}{2}'' \times \frac{3}{32}''$ in the following teeth sizes :

40, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54 Teeth.

These rings can be built up in any teeth combinations as required.

CRANKS : Type 57 Cranks are available in lengths of $6\frac{1}{2}$ inch, $6\frac{3}{4}$ inch, 7 inch.

Screws and Nuts

Each set is composed of one screw, one washer and one bush. Referred to as one set screw/washer/bush Type 57.

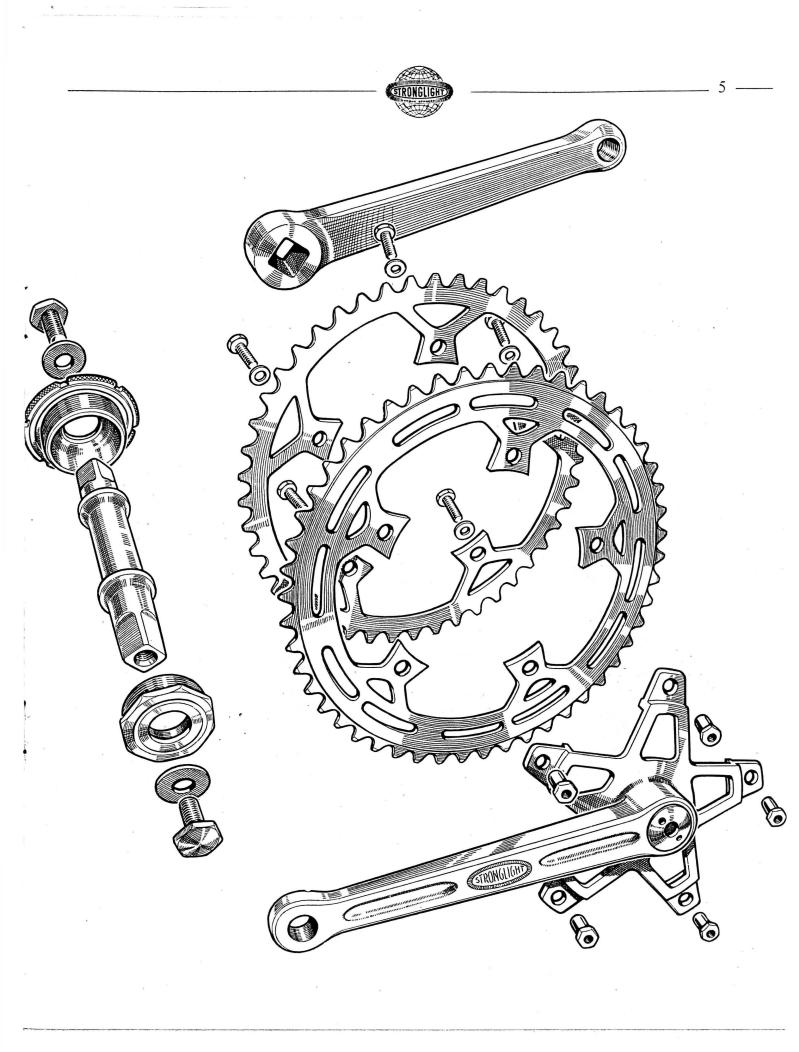

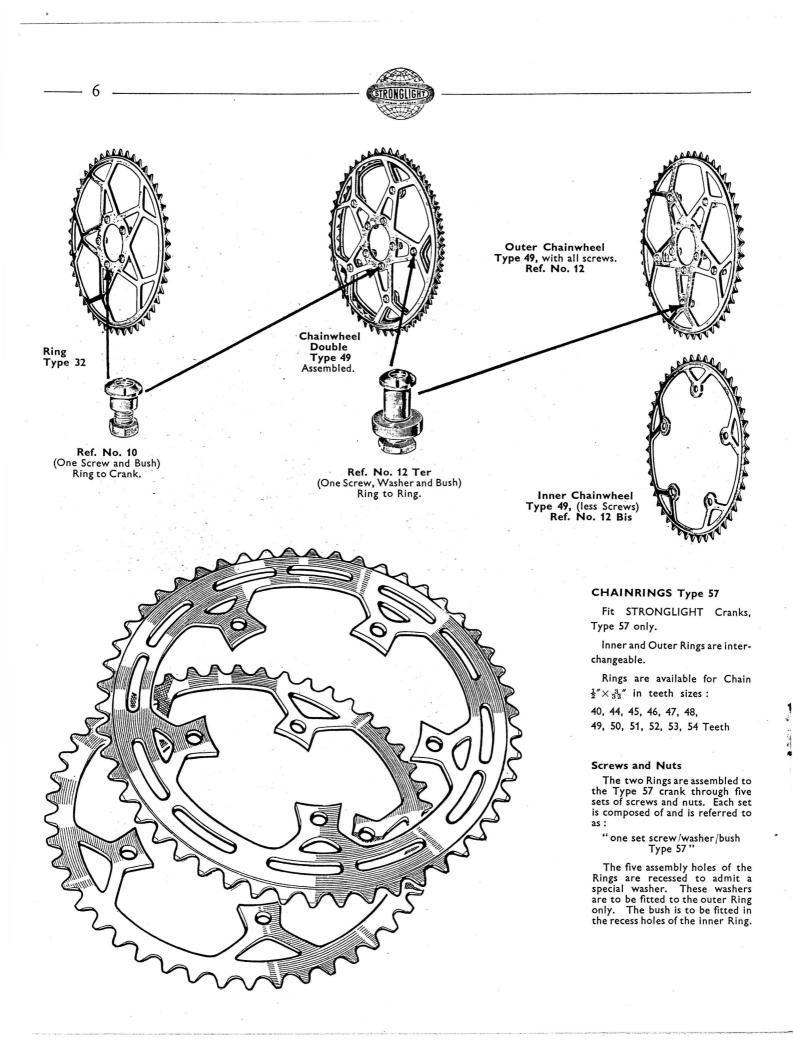

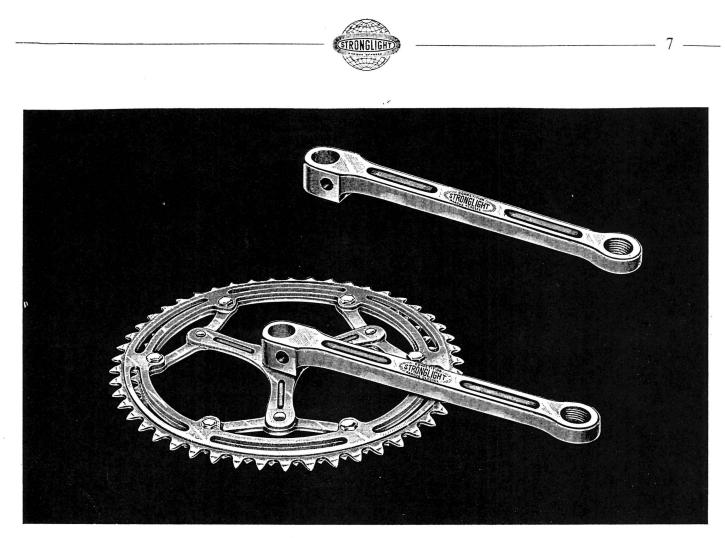

STRONGLIGHT "COMPETITION "CRANKS No. 55

This is a 3-arm solid forged crank set made of high resistance steel with HEAVY SECTION.

It has been specially designed for racing.

The clearance on the right hand crank is such that it permits the use of a 3-arm Double chainwheel as well as a Single chainwheel.

No. 55 Cranks are available in lengths of $6\frac{1}{2}^{"}$, $6\frac{3}{4}^{"}$ and 7 inch. Weight per pair : Approximately 20-oz.

These cranks are delivered Boxed per one pair (one right hand with screws, one left hand).

Screws : For assembling crank to ring are referred to as Crank Screws type 54/55.

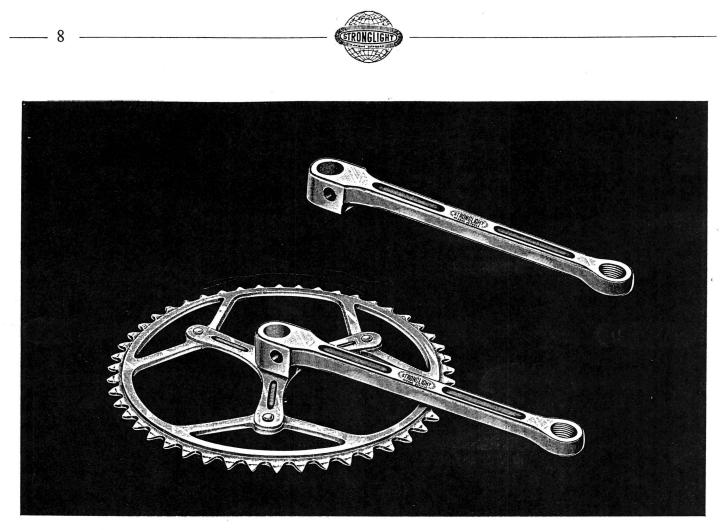
DOUBLE CHAINWHEEL

This is a 3-arm all steel, chromium plated double chainring for chains $\frac{1}{2}''\times\frac{3}{32}''$, (Double chain rest).

Inner and outer rings are assembled by a screw and bush, and both rings are interchangeable. Rings are available in Teeth sizes : 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54 Teeth.

Weight of one Double chainwheel assembled, approximately 16-oz.

NOTE : These double chainwheels can also be fitted to our Cranks No. 54.

STRONGLIGHT "STANDARD " CRANKS No. 54

This is a 3-arm solid forged crank set made of high resistance steel, with LIGHT SECTION.

It is equally suitable for Touring and Racing and whenever a reduced weight in a steel crank is required.

The clearance on the right hand crank permits the use of a 3-arm single or double chainwheel.

No. 54 cranks are available in one length only : $6\frac{3}{4}$ ". Weight per pair 18-oz.

These cranks are delivered Boxed, per one pair, (one right hand with screws, one left hand).

Screws : for assembling crank to ring are referred to as Crank screws Type 54/55.

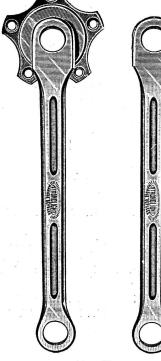
SINGLE CHAINWHEEL

No. 34

A Bottom Bracket assembly is one of the components which takes the greatest punishment in Cycle Racing.

If the set is unsatisfactory, the bearings will be pitted rapidly or the axle will break or get deformed.

Thus, to make a Bottom Bracket set that will give entire satisfaction as to lightness of weight, reliability of bearings and strength of axle, considerable experience in manufacture is required.

The Stronglight Bottom Bracket Set No. 34 has proved its quality in many major racing events. The No. 34 set is made from a top grade Nickel Chrome Steel Alloy.

The Axle is hollow from end to end to reduce weight.

The fixed cup is Octagonal, the adjustable cup is hexagonal. Both cups are designed for minimum weight.

Weight of the complete assembly : 10-oz.

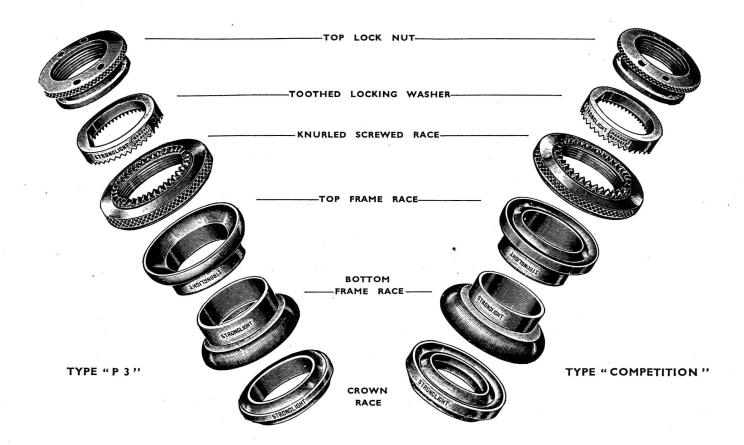

STRONGLIGHT HEAD SETS

STRONGLIGHT Head Sets are made of the highest quality nickel chrome steel. Bearing surfaces are precision ground and hardened to limit tolerances. STRONGLIGHT Head Sets are made to flt British bicycles, using standard dimension Head Tubes of $1\frac{1}{4}$ " diameter, gauge 20 and steering column 1 inch threaded 24 threads to the inch.

This is a high quality conventional bearing Head Set, suitable for all good class machines, including Racing bicycles. Weight complete : 4-oz. This set is made to take steel balls $\frac{5}{52}$ diameter

Type "Competition "

This is a high quality Head Set using V type bearings.

This type of bearing is particularly suited for longer life and this set is recommended for Racing bicycles especially machines engaged in tough Stage Racing.

V type bearings are difficult to manufacture and require the greatest care in grounding as tolerances must be very small. Type "Competition" Head Set is made as a precision engineering component. Weight complete : 6-oz. This set is made to take steel balls $\frac{55^{27}}{32^{27}}$ diameter.

Fitting of Head Sets.

To get the top quality results that may be expected from our Head Sets, it is necessary to take certain essential precautions when fitting. Ensure that the fork is well constructed, and that the fork column is perpendicular to the fork crown.

Ensure that the Crown Race of the Head Set is well seated and is fitted square to the fork column. Fit the remaining parts of the head set, including the knurled screwed race. This latter part should be screwed in without overtightening.

If the head set is correctly fitted the fork will move easily from left to right without any play in the bearing and without jamming at any point. If this required result is not achieved, the Head Set may not be considered as correctly fitted.

Fit the remaining components and lock the assembly with the TOP LOCK NUT.

NOTE :

Before fitting Head Set, make absolutely sure that all bearing surfaces are wiped dry and clean, then lubricate with light bearing grease.



HEAD SETS AND BOTTOM BRACKET SETS

A finely shaped Handlebar Bend, an attractive stem, a "racy" frame, a Simplex gear, these are "exciting" items which, not unnaturally, attract and hold the attention of Cyclists.

However, Head Fitting assemblies and Bottom Bracket sets are not usually in the class of "exciting" lines, and quite wrongly, since the quality of a bicycle *depends* on these products. Imagine what will happen to the racing Cyclist if in the middle of a race the steering develops "play" or the Bottom Bracket set gets loose, or the axle bends. No immediate repairs can be made like replacing a tyre or changing a wheel, the bicycle must be changed. Whilst this can be done and is usual practice in International Professional racing, the amateur competitor can hardly afford to do it. Hence, the amateur must perforce rely very heavily on the outstanding quality of the Head Fitting set and the Bottom Bracket set fitted to his machine.

CAN a cyclist identify a Quality set by looking at it?

The answer is most unlikely. A Head set can look very attractive in design, beautifully chrome plated and be second rate in actual use. A Bottom Bracket axle can look solid and "business-like" and yet it may bend as the Cyclist applies his full pedalling power in a moment of final intense effort. Many makers will claim the use of special steel in the manufacture of these items and claim quite rightly that this gives superiority to their product. However, the story does not end there. It is not enough to use special steel, to make a good Head set and Bottom Bracket set. The design of the bearings, the angle at which the steel balls roll, play a very important part in the ultimate quality.

But above all, the degree of hardening of the bearing surfaces will "make or break" a reputation.

Head sets and Bottom Bracket sets designed for Competition must be just right. If the hardening goes too far, the bearing race will shatter like a nut shell, if not hard enough, the steel balls will begin indenting the ball race and very soon the set will be useless.

Precision equipment is used by some manufacturers to obtain that "just right" state, but as in the case of all machines the quality of the end product will depend largely on the men who operate them. There is also the question of the quality of the Steel Alloy used. The "Right" hardening is only right if the steel used is absolutely in accordance with the original test specifications, and with to-day's conditions, this is by no means a simple affair.

Thus the manufacturer of such items has a serious problem to keep the quality of his product beyond reproach.

Special steel, precision ground bearings, "just right "hardening, qualified labour with years of experience, all this adds up to high cost of the finished product.

The Cyclist has but one sure way to guide him in his choice and that is, that he purchases a Head set and a Bottom Bracket set that has already achieved a reputation for quality.

STRONGLIGHT Products have enjoyed this high reputation for quality for over twenty years.

STRONGLIGHT WIN THE HOUR SPEED RECORD 1957

The world record for the hour won by Roger Riviere on STRONGLIGHT has brought up an intriguing question in the World of Cycling. "Has the track equipment improved over the years or has the quality remained static?"

The answer is by no means a simple one since whilst the quality of some equipment has not changed much over the years, other components have been drastically improved although such improvement may have passed unnoticed to the noninitiated.

From the start, track riders have understood the necessity of using ultra light-weight equipment allied with the optimum in rigidity, a problem which is by no means a simple one as you will readily appreciate. Modern techniques in processing steel and light alloy have considerably improved in recent years, and the benefits of such techniques have been incorporated in the manufacture of STRONGLIGHT products.

An examination of the winning machine of Roger Riviere with which he beat the record at 46 km. 923 in 60 minutes, tells its own story. It is equipped with STRONGLIGHT special steel "Competition" Head Set, STRONGLIGHT Alloy Cranks and Chainrings and STRONGLIGHT Cotterless Bettom Bracket Set.

We all know the importance of the effort imposed on the chainwheel and crank set in track racing and it is of course to the credit of STRONGLIGHT that our material was used throughout. What is more important is the fact that Riviere has used the STRONGLIGHT ALLOY SET, thus proving dramatically what we ourselves have always known, which is that STRONG-LIGHT ALLOY Components give the optimum in rigidity allied to the minimum in weight. In Great Britain, alloy cranks and rings are establishing their supremacy on the track after passing through a period of suspicion which was earned through the years by material which did not give satisfaction and which was DEFINITELY NOT STRONGLIGHT.

It is now 20 years since the great French Champion Archambaud won the record of the hour on STRONGLIGHT ALLOY cranks and rings.

Archambaud, Anquetil, Riviere, Louison Bobet, these are names that cannot be lightly dismissed, they trusted STRONG-LIGHT equipment, it never failed them. The same equipment, continually improved over the years is available throughout the British Commonwealth.

The following important factor concerning chainwheel and crank sets must be brought to the attention of the discriminating cyclist.

In road racing, using an extra flexible chain and a Derailleur gear, a slight eccentricity on the chainwheel and crank, though not by any means satisfactory, could be overlooked as the transmission system is flexible, but in track racing, where the chain length is adjusted to optimum, and where there is no room for unwanted flexibility, an imperfection in the concentricity of the chainwheel and crank becomes a major disaster. Thus such specialised equipment as STRONGLIGHT Cotterless must perforce be treated as a precision engineering product and the price is naturally affected.

STRONGLIGHT Victories are not limited to the Track.

Through the years STRONGLIGHT products won a most impressive honours list, including nineteen World Championships, twenty-seven Championships of France, The Tours of France, of Belgium, of Spain, and many other major victories.

These victories in such major racing events are the very best testimonial for our products, and the best guarantee that with STRONGLIGHT you have the very best.

You will readily appreciate the value of this assertion when you learn of the following facts :---

Head Sets : Most makes of Head Sets are unsuitable for racing cycles. It is a matter of common knowledge amongst Tour de France mechanics that Head Sets not specially made for Racing cannot last more than a few stages in the "Tour de France".

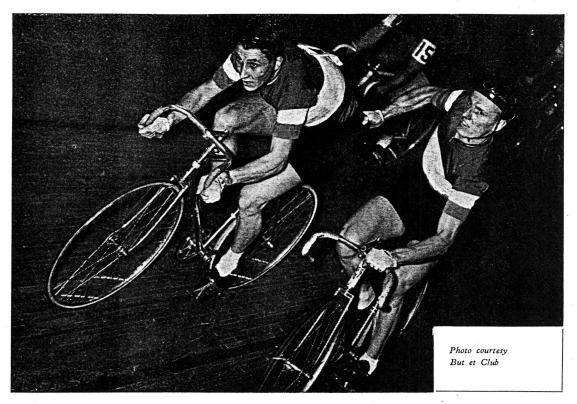
For this reason, Champions fit STRONGLIGHT.

Bottom Bracket Sets : Same comment as above.

Cranks : You may think that any "good" steel crank will do for racing. If you do, you will undoubtedly learn differently from experience. In the Tour de France, riders have broken their cranks, bent them, stripped the threads (with Pedal falling off). As a result of these misfortunes, the field of choice in racing cranks has been considerably narrowed and the great majority of Champions fit our products. Amongst Riders in the "Tour de France" about 80% fit STRONGLIGHT.

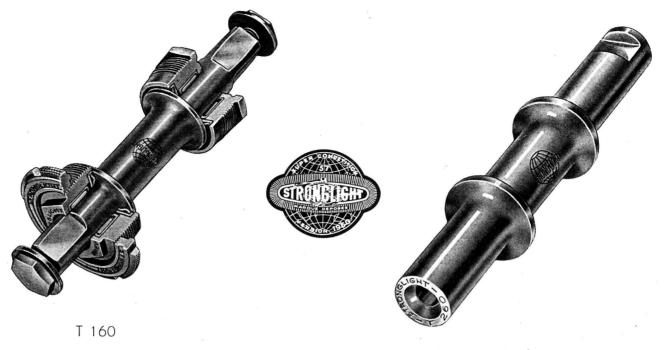
